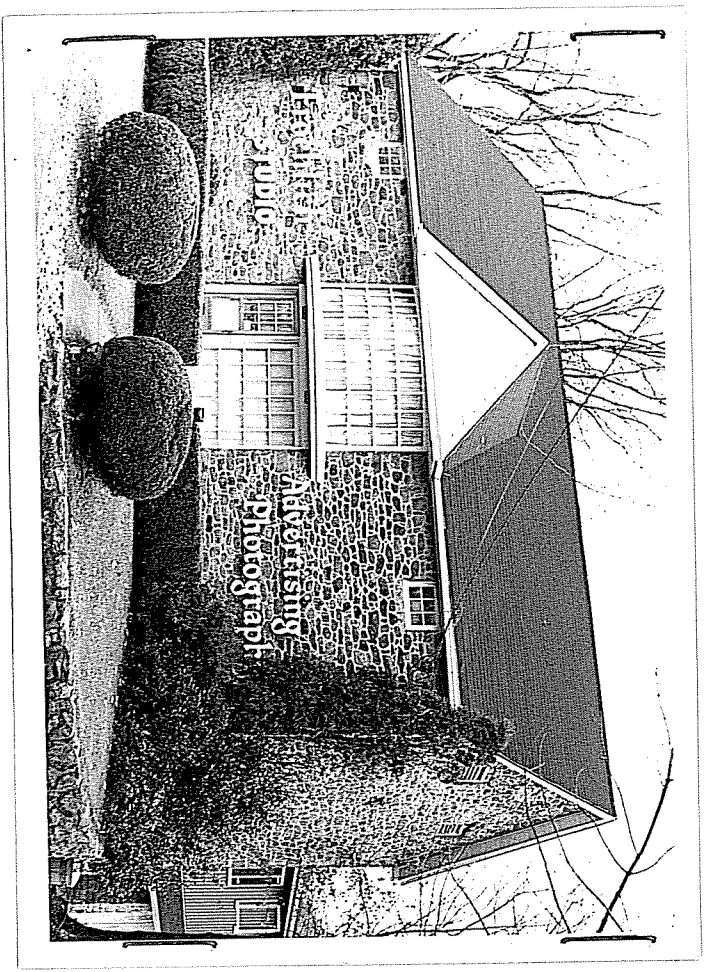

STUDIO-Section 1 - Former cattle barn;converted approximately 24 years ago into a Photographer's Studio - 2-1/2 stories, double pile, fieldstone construction on stone foundation, quoins, asphalt shingle gable roof, boxed cornice, rafter ends exposed, fascia board.

1st floor - South face - 4 bays, (2) windows, 3 lites each, (1) window, 6 fixed lites, (1) box stall door.

2nd floor - 3 bays, (1) window, 42 lites with side lites, 21 in each, (1) window, 6 lites, (1) window, 8 lites.

WELL-Section 1 - Fieldstone well situated next to Barn - wood shingle gable roof, Interior: 2 square wood posts support roof, crank handle still attached to post.

NOTES: Property was once part of a complex which included a residence, carriage house, root cellar, and spring house. A datestone on the carriage house reads "I. B. 1800". A storey is passed on that I. Beans was almost "read out of the meeting" when he built the bank barn (now photo studio) as it was too "fine" a structure for a Quaker.
