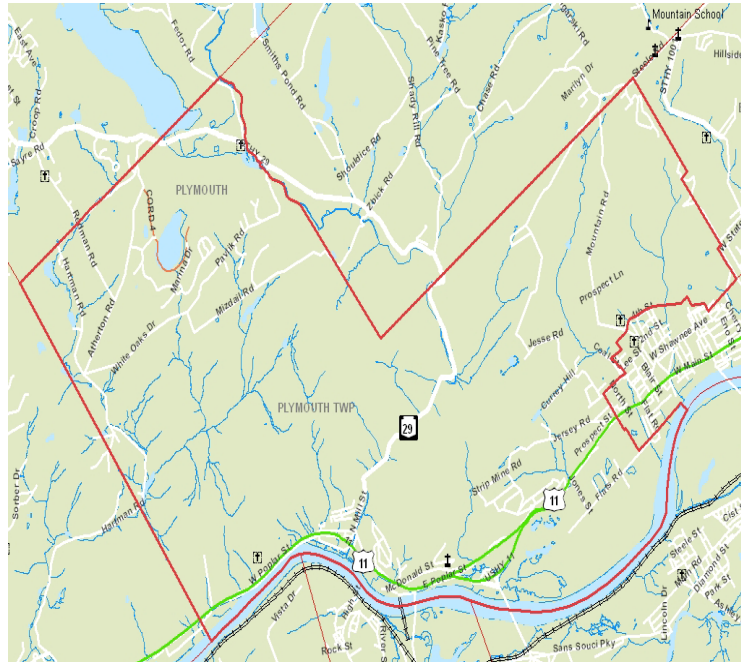

Community Description

Plymouth Township is a municipality of 2,097 population (2000 census) located along the North Branch of the Susquehanna River in the Wyoming Valley “hard coal” region of Luzerne County. The Township has a total area of 17.5 square miles. The Township has provided basic municipal services to its residents consisting of road maintenance, garbage, and recycling collection and disposal, sanitary sewer service, zoning/building inspections, and park services.

The elected officials of Plymouth Township include a three-person Board of Supervisors, elected at large, which serves as the Legislative and Executive branches of government; the elected Tax Collector, who collects both real estate taxes and per capita taxes levied by the Township; and a three-person Board of Auditors which is charged with auditing the financial records of the Township on an annual basis.

Plymouth Township’s main business district, which consists of many small businesses, is along State Route 11 in the West Nanticoke section of the Township.
