




What's happening?

How did we get here?






Consumer Response to Product Shortages





- Tariffs created inefficient short-term trade workarounds




City lockdowns/"Work From Home"

- Supply chain disruptions have a long tail












Impact of China's "Zero-COVID" Policies



Ocean freight demand and rates remain high in Q4 2020 as countries enter different phases of the pandemic.




- Lower consumption in early 2020 prompted "catch-up effect"
- Oct. 2020: Only 1.6% of the world's shipping fleet was inactive
- Record volume at ports
- Ships sailed below full capacity due to container shortages


Port Congestion Issues


Shipping Demand Surges









Chinese New Year - 2021

- Thousands of factories shut down for several weeks
- Production slows as demand spikes
- Increased shipping congestion

Texas Freeze – Feb. 2021

- Mass blackouts led to factory shutdowns
- Supply chain impact like a hurricane
- Diversion of natural gas production for fertilizer use
- Petrochemicals/plastic shortages
- Trucking disruptions

Suez Canal Blocked – Mar. 2021

- Ever Given stuck in canal for six days
- 30% of global container traffic uses canal annually
- Smaller ports unable to take on large ships
- Delayed returns of empty containers to Asia



Hurricane Ida – Sept. 2021

- Increased Pressure on Input Costs
 - Damage shuts down largest U.S. glyphosate production facility
 - Fertilizer production plants idled
 - Grain & fertilizer shipping logistics strained



Chinese Energy Restrictions


- China's power supply becomes limited late 2021
 - Summer flooding in key coal producing areas
 - Sharp increase in production as demand spiked
 - CCP goal for a carbon neutral China by 2060
- Skyrocketing energy costs
- Rolling blackouts
- Limited factory operations


2022 Input Costs Skyrocket

2022 Input Costs Skyrocket

- Crop protection product costs spike
 - Production limitations in China
 - Hurricane Ida
- Fertilizer prices increase 2x+ from Fall 2020 to Fall 2021
 - Increase in natural gas prices worldwide
 - International anti-dumping trade disputes
 - Texas Freeze/Hurricane Ida
 - COVID disruptions to production plants
 - Narrow demand in 2020 followed by rapid expansion as commodity prices increased
 - China restricts exports to ensure domestic supplies
- Back to the toilet paper theory...
 - Appearance of extreme limited supply = consumer crisis

2022 Beijing Olympics

- China adds further energy restrictions prior to 2022
 Winter Olympics to reduce smog
- Enhanced lockdowns for "zero-COVID" games
 - Quarantine impacts on container shipping & air travel
- Chinese New Year compounds effects









* The change in oil prices from February 2022 to March 2022 was the 16th largest on record, and the change in wheat prices in March 2022 was the seventh largest on record, after the Russian Grain Deal and Dust Bowl/WWII period (three months in 1933 were in the top six, and two of those months are excluded for brevity). Note: Historical crude oil prices are available back to 1946 via the Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis, and the U.S. Department of Agriculture provides data on wheat prices back to 1908. 

Differences in Railway Track Gauge




Food Insecurity Impact








Russia/Ukraine Conflict Impact on Fuel Prices

Shanghai in Lockdown

- March 2022: Shanghai, China placed in strict lockdown due to COVID outbreaks
- Impacts:
 - Increased shipping congestion in the Port of Shanghai
 - Trucking services limited
 - Factory shutdowns
- Lockdowns eased in June
 - Some restrictions remain



- Emergency testing resumed July 5


Ships waiting outside Shanghai and Ningo ports in mid-April 2022 amid delays caused by COVID lockdowns

Travel Density in Major Chinese Cities




2022 Shanghai lockdown was severe, but not as severe as 2020

What's Ahead?

- Continued "long-tail" consequences of severe disruptions to supply chain
- Fallout of Russia/Ukraine War
 - Lasting impact on grain & energy supplies
- Domestic trucking shortages
- 2023 U.S. Crop Input Availability
 - Pricing expected to remain elevated

- Seed, chem, fertilizer all expected to be in supply
- Increased investment in domestic fertilizer production
- Hopefully, a supply chain that can adapt quickly to future "black swans"
