square feet.

Two-bedroom apartment: Seven hundred fifty (750) square feet.

Three-bedroom apartment: Nine hundred (900) square feet.

Four- or more bedroom apartment: One thousand one hundred (1,100) square feet.

Single-family dwellings: Nine hundred (900) square feet.

- (d) The lot occupied by an apartment building shall have at least five thousand five hundred (5,500) square feet of area for each apartment.
- (e) The lot occupied by a single-family dwelling shall be subject to the same lot area requirements as single-family dwellings in R-9 Residential Districts.
- (f) Off-street parking and loading will be subject to the requirements of Articles XI and XII of this chapter. (Ord. of 6-22-82)

ARTICLE IX-A. B-1 LIMITED BUSINESS DISTRICTS

Sec. 25-103.1. Purpose.

The B-1 Limited Business Districts are intended to provide space for limited business and commercial development and uses in areas near or adjoining residential development providing services primarily to the nearby population.

Sec. 25-103.2. Permitted uses.

- (a) The following uses shall be permitted within the B-1 Limited Business Districts; subject to the requirements set forth in section 25-103.13.
 - (1) Auto parts store, not including installation or repair work.
 - (2) Bakery shop.
 - (3) Bank, finance or savings office, including drive-in type.
 - (4) Barbershop.
 - (5) Beauty shop.

- (6) Bicycle shop.
- (7) Candy store.
- (8) Card, novelty or gift shop.
- (9) Church or other place of worship.
- (10) Clothes store.
- (11) Drug store.
- (12) Delicatessen.
- (13) Fabric shop.
- (14) Florist shop.
- (15) Grocery store.
- (16) Hardware store.
- (17) Laundromats or coin-operated dry cleaning.
- (18) Laundry or drycleaning shop and pickup station.
- (19) Lawn or garden center, greenhouse.
- (20) Library.
- (21) Liquor store.
- (22) Medical facility or clinic.
- (23) Newspaper or magazine store.
- (24) Offices, business, professional or governmental.
- (25) Paint or wallpaper store.
- (26) Pet grooming shop.
- (27) Police, fire or rescue squad station.
- (28) Post office.
- (29) Restaurant, not including drive-in establishment.
- (30) Sewing machine sales, instruction, or service.

- (31) Shoe sale or repair shop.
- (32) Signs as regulated in Article XIV of this chapter.
- (33) Sporting goods store.
- (34) Veterinary clinic or animal hospital, including indoor kennel.
- (35) Video rental or sales.
- (b) The following uses are prohibited unless a special use permit is obtained from the board of zoning appeals, subject to the requirements set forth in section 25-103.13:
 - (1) Automobile service station.
 - (2) Bowling alley, pool hall, billiard parlor or similar enterprises.
 - (3) Drive-in eating establishment.
 - (4) Funeral home.
 - (5) Parking lot as a principal use.
 - (6) Utility transformer stations, treatment plants, pumping stations, generating stations, major transmission lines or towers, or telephone exchanges.
 - (7) Video or other coin operated amusements as a principal use.
 - (8) Any use for which a special use permit is required by section 25-103.13.

Sec. 25-103.3 Accessory buildings and uses.

Accessory buildings and uses are permitted subject to the requirements set forth in sections 25-103.13 and 25-153.1. Temporary buildings for uses incidental to construction work shall be removed upon completion or abandonment of the construction work.

Sec. 25-103.4. Prohibited uses.

All uses except those listed in sections 25-103.2 and 25-103.3 are specifically prohibited.
