William Thomas Crafton was born in King William County, Virginia, on July 2, 1829, to Thomas R. and Lucy A. Crafton. By 1850, William Crafton had moved to Louisa County, Virginia, where he boarded with Andrew and Jane Nelson and worked as a carpenter.

On October 24, 1854, he married the Nelson's 16-year-old daughter, Mary Elizabeth (1838-1916), in Louisa County. The marriage appears to have been a success, as they would have at least ten children: Hugh, Jeter, Cora, William, Jane, Mary, James, John, Lucy, and Carey.

During the decade following their marriage, the Craftons resided in the eastern portion of the county, where they had a farm near Frederick's Hall. During the Civil War, Mr. Crafton enlisted as a private in Company I (Captain Braxton's Company), 30th Regiment, Virginia Infantry. He fought throughout the war, being taken prisoner at the war's end. After he executed the Oath of Parole on May 16, 1865, he returned home to Louisa County and returned to farming.

By 1880, he had relocated to the Livingston District, Spotsylvania County, Virginia. He was living there when he died on May 14, 1894.

Carpenter both of the County of Spottsylvania and State of Virginia Witnesseth that in consideration of One thousand dollars lawful money of Virginia in hand paid or satisfactorily arranged to the said Joseph F. Carpenter by the said Nathaniel D. Carpenter the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the said Joseph F. Carpenter doth grant and convey unto the said Nathaniel D. Carpenter all that Tract or parcel of land on which the said Joseph F. Carpenter at present resides containing six lots bought of the heirs of Robert Allipson with deed and numbered as follows in the plat of said division viz Lot No. 2. containing 16 $\frac{1}{4}$ acres, Lot No. 3. 24 $\frac{1}{4}$ acres, Lot No. 4. 14 $\frac{1}{4}$ acres Lot No. 5. 15 acres Lot No. 6. 32 $\frac{1}{4}$ acres, and Lot 7. 38 $\frac{1}{4}$ acres, making in all One hundred and forty and three quarters acres, adjoining and bounded by the lands of Schude Blaydes Emily Rogers and the Estate of Edward G. Hill dead with general warranty. Witness the following signatures and seal

In the Name of God amen: I Henry Leaspendy being of sound mind and disposing memory, hereby do make this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all others: First: I desire that all my just debts shall be paid as soon after my decease as practicable.

Secondly: I give to my three daughters, Sarah F. Ellen C. and Dorothy M. Leaspendy, the farm on which I reside with all its appurtenances, and I give to my beloved wife Mary during her natural life a joint home and occupation in said farm, to get her with my said three daughters.

Thirdly: I give to my beloved wife in fee simple, Rose and her two daughters Sally and Melly, with their increase.

Fourthly: I give to my two grandsons, Sarah F. and Dorothy M. Leaspendy, Remond and her son Billy.

Fifthly: I give to my daughter, Ellen C. Leaspendy, a negro man named, Fortaine.

Sixthly: I give to my daughter, Lucy Ann Holladay, two negroes named, Layton and Lewis.

Seventhly: I give to my son James two negroes named, Koo and Salina.

Eighthly: I direct that my Executor shall sell all my personal property except the slaves named in this will, and apply the proceeds of said sale to the payment of my debts; and in the event that said proceeds shall not be sufficient to pay my debts; then I direct that all my children shall pay in equal ratable portions the residue of my debts, and that the negroes herein bequeathed to them severally shall be liable for the payment of said residue of my debts.

Ninthly: I appoint my son James C. Leaspendy and my son-in-law, William M. Holladay Executors of this my last will and testament. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hands and seal this 13th day of April 1860.
