Use water bars to direct runoff out of plowed breaks on sloping land. Plow or disk as needed to remove all burnable material before the fire season. Firebreaks on erodible soils should be planted to cool season grasses for erosion control. Pest Management

Control sod-forming grasses (bermudagrass & bahiagrass) and undesirable weeds (kudzu, wisteria, privet and others) with herbicides reduce competition with longleaf pine and native warm season grasses. Bermudagrass, bahigrass and other pests must be eradicated prior to planting longleaf pines. Read and follow label directions in the handling and application of all pesticides. The University of Georgia Cooperative Extension Service or a certified pesticide applicator should be consulted for recommendations, rates, timing, and application of pesticides for weed or insect control. Prescribed Burning

Apply controlled fire to the area as necessary to control undesirable vegetation, control plant disease, reduce wildfire hazards and improve wildlife habitat. Refer to the enclosed "Prescribed Burning for Wildlife Habitat" Job Sheet for more information. Burning should be carried out on approximately a 3 year rotation to maintain the optimum habitat. Seedlings will be planted to control erosion, improve water quality and improve wildlife habitat. Planting will meet NRCS standards & specs and the requirements of FSA's Conservation Reserve Program. 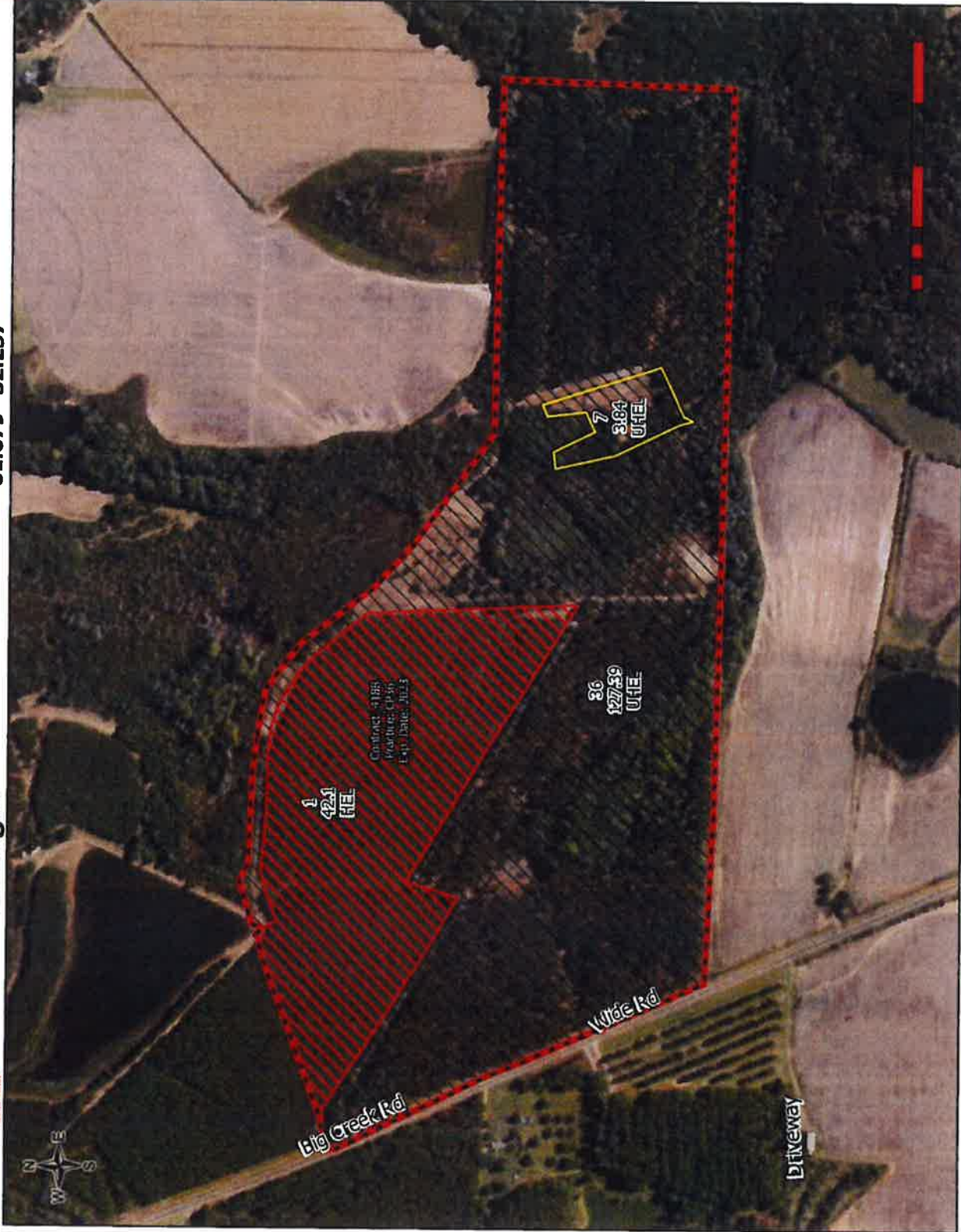

Use water bars to direct runoff out of plowed breaks on sloping land. Plow or disk as needed to remove all burnable material before the fire season. Firebreaks on erodible soils should be planted to cool season grasses for erosion control. Natural barriers, such as ponds, lakes, streams, roads, cultivated fields, railroads and utility right-of-ways also serve as fire breaks.

Pest Management

Control sod-forming grasses (Bermudagrass & bahiagrass) and undesirable weeds (kudzu, wisteria, privet and others) with herbicides reduce competition with longleaf pine and native warm season grasses. Bermudagrass, bahiagrass and other pests must be eradicated prior to planting longleaf pines. Read and follow label directions in the handling and application of all pesticides. Prescribed Burning
