B-3 District dimensional controls require a minimum frontage of 150 feet and a minimum square footage of 30,000 square feet. *See* Bylaws §4.4. The Property has 100 feet of frontage on Hildreth Street and contains approximately 10,000 square feet. As such, the Property is a preexisting non-confirming single-family home which may be reconstructed, extended, altered, or structurally changed upon Building Inspector's determination that the proposed change does not increase the non-conforming nature of the structure. *See* Bylaws §3.5.5.

The Business and Commercial uses permitted for B-3 District are as follows:

- (1) **Business Uses** Retail Store (<5,000 G.S.F), Professional Office, Financial Service, Restaurant (non fast food), Hotel, Inn/Motel, Lodge/Club, Funeral Home, Veterinary Care, Personal/General Services, Studios, Building Trade Shops;
- (2) Governmental, Institutional & Public Services Uses Municipal, Museums, Educational, Religious, Nursing Home or Post Office.

A Special Permit may be required to convert the Property from single-family to a use that is permitted in B-3 District.
